

Camp site Information and Rules



Silent hours on site 11pm - 7 am

- On arrival please report to reception, before going to your camp site.
- Main entrance to the camp site to drop off kit to set up your camp in cars is half way down the main drive. Please remove cars off the campsite as soon as you have unloaded.
- This is for leaders only. Not for parents bringing children to drive on to the camp site. Cars are not permitted to stay on the camp site over night and need to be parked in the main car park opposite Icen House.
- There are 9 campsites separated by trees and wooded areas, camp site size's vary and can accommodate groups of around 20 - 50 people.
- Sites 5 and 7 are larger and can hold groups of over 50 campers.
These numbers are just a guide and are dependent on the type of tents used and the arrangement of the camp.
- Sites 7 & 8 have a site hut with electric, with a fridge, lighting and fire extinguisher.
- Any electrical items that you wish to use on site must have be PAT Tested with in the last 12 months. (If they have not been tested they are not allowed to be used on site.)
- A Water supply is on or close to each site.
- Wheelie bins are provided for campers (situated behind the campsite toilet block) to have on their site for the duration of the camp. Waste needs to be placed in bin bags in the bins and bins emptied in to the main refuse point.
(At the end of the main car park) and then returned to the bin collection point at the end of the stay empty and clean.
- Wet and dry pits are not permitted. Arrangements for the disposal of any wet waste are to be above the ground only.
- There is a toilet and shower block for use by all campers. Toilet cubicles and wash basins are provided for males and females. There are 6 individual cubicles and 1 accessible toilet and shower.
- Meadows beside the river can be used as games areas as well as providing access to the river itself.
- No open ground fires are to be created on the campsite. Alter fires are available for use, please ask a member of staff where you can collect them from along with a designated wood pile for burning wood on them. (or you can burn dead wood found on the ground in the woodland areas)
- If you would like to book the campfire circle for your group please see a member of staff in reception, you can have it just for your self's, or why not invite other groups camping to come and join you make new friends, and learn new songs!
- At the end of your stay please ensure Alter fires are returned from where collected from, all ashes from them are to be put on the main camp fire circle, and any leftover wood is put back on the wood pile.
- Please check your site before you depart for any pegs in the ground and do a litter sweep of your camp site.
- Once you are ready to depart, and your site is clear please get a member of staff to come and check you out from your campsite.
- If you are unsure where anything is there is a large information board and site map opposite the camp site toilets, or if you have a question, query, or need to report something that may broken or not working, please pop in to reception where one of the team will be happy to help.
- We hope you have a fantastic time staying with us; customer satisfaction surveys are located in reception, so please fill one out, as we would love to hear what you think of your time here with us. Have a good camp, *from the Eaton Vale Team.*



Entrance Gate and Site Security

The main entrance gate is manually opened and closed daily by a member of staff.

Each day the gate will be opened between 8.00 – 8.30 am and closed between 8.30 – 9.00 pm

The gate has a code lock on it to ensure security of the site overnight and will not be left open over night.

The group leader in charge of visiting residential/camping groups will be given the code for emergency access only during silent hours.

Please do not pass on the code without good reason.
